Welcome to the second newsletter of the #SolutionNotPollution project!

We are already in the 6th month of our project and despite the uncertain times we have just gone through, the SolutionNotPollution team has not been idle!

A quick reminder of our objectives in case you need it. SolutionNotPollution wants to introduce challenged-based learning in youth work to address the issue of climate change. To achieve this, we are working to develop a training programme for youth workers so that they can introduce climate change in their work with young people and develop their own WebQuest challenges, while also having access to a range of 24 Climate Change WebQuests that they can implement in their activities with young people.

The period of lock-down that all European countries have gone through has allowed us to reinvent our ways of working and to realise that, despite the distance, thanks to online communication tools, we can develop quality work with our partners.





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What has happened so far?

The project kick-off meeting was held in Paris in February 2020. We were able to plan the first months of work for the project and the partnership was on schedule. From then on, here is what we have accomplished in 6 months:

- Within the framework of the training programme for youth workers (IO1), under the supervision of FIP from Ireland, the partnership developed the following elements:
- FIP (Ireland) developed a document detailing the learning objectives to be achieved by the training curriculum
- This document was submitted to the local experts identified by each partner who were able to provide their opinions via an online form.
- Once this feedback was collated, FIP then worked to develop a complete 21-hour faceto-face curriculum to guide youth workers in how to develop their own challenge-based learning resources.
- SOLUTION (France) and JKPeV (Germany)
 have respectively created the self-directed
 learning modules for youth workers so that
 they can improve their knowledge of climate
 change and online and social entrepreneurship.

As part of the development of challenge-based learning resources (WebQuest, IO2), the following was undertaken by the partners:

- SOLUTION specified the learning outcomes to be achieved by each WebQuest according to the previously defined themes:
- Bruised Not Broken
- Low Plastic Diet
- Taking the upcycling challenge
- Ethical Fashion Shopping
- Sustaibable Plate

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What's next?

It is difficult to have a clear picture in our minds of how the next months will unfold... The modules on challenge-based learning, climate change and online and social entrepreneurship (IO1) should be tested in real-time by youth workers from France, Germany, Czech Repiblic and Ireland at a transnational training event to be held in Ireland before the end of 2020. Following this test, the modules will be finalised and translated into the languages of the partnership. We will keep you informed of

developments in the coming months.

The partners will continue to develop WebQuests (IO2) on all of the above themes.

Finally, the training curriculum for online and social entrepreneurship (IO3) will be launched. AKLUB (Czech Republic) will develop a document detailing the learning objectives to be achieved in the coming months.

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
